Doe Kid: Young Female


Wether: Castrated Male

ANATOMY



TIP

Always start with a clean and dry animal; a good bath can make all the difference on show day.





NECK, BACK & REAR



1. Always make sure your animal is safely secured. Start around the neck with the back-dragging technique using an Andis Medium Blending blade. Clip with the grain of the hair, cutting it shorter in the front. Blend the neck with the shoulder.



2. Move onto the toploin, apply light pressure to the clipper and clip with the grain, moving from the chine to the rump.



3. Blend the rear to the hind legs using an Andis Super Blocking blade (or Medium Blending blade). Back-drag the clipper teeth lightly with the grain to blend.

LEGS, BELLY & TAIL



1. Lift the tail out of the way and blend the rump into the back legs.



2. Switch to a Medium Blending blade and hold the front leg up to clip the belly area using the back-dragging technique.



3. Blend the leg from the hock up and back-drag down.



4. Clip the tail with a **Medium Blending** blade in the direction of the hair growth. Round off at the tip.

HEAD & FACE



1. Start clippping at the top of the head using an Andis Super Blocking blade or Medium Blending blade. Make sure to round the nose.



2. Use the back-dragging technique on the cheeks and into the top of the head. Clip in every direction to remove loose hair and create a very natural look.

FOR GOATS WITH HORNS



1. Clip the head using an Andis #T-84 blade. Blend the top of the head and neck area.



2. Use the back-dragging technique with the #T-84 blade to blend the head into the horn area.

SLICK SHEARING A WETHER

If you plan on showing a doe, you never want to use the slick shear method, as the coat will not grow back appropriately for show day.

- 1. Using a Pulse ZR* II clipper with either a 5FC or **4FC** blade on it, place the blade flat against the coat and shear the entire body of the goat, clipping against the grain.
- 2. Be sure to also get underneath the animal, being careful around areas of loose skin and the genitals.
- 3. On the legs, start from the hock moving upward, clipping against the grain.
